# St. Valentine School Curriculum Highlights Grade 8

## Students entering Grade 8 will be expected to:

- Students will continue to develop more independent organizational skills.
- They will acquire acceptable social skills; grow in self-confidence and responsibility.
- Participate fully in class discussion and activities.
- · Leadership roles in the school community are encouraged.
- Follow the St. Valentine Student Code of Conduct.
- Be responsible for and accountable for their school work and their actions.
- Students will keep a homework planner updated daily.

Parents and teachers will guide the students in this ongoing process. A class website updated weekly will facilitate this process.

## **RELIGION**

In Grade 8, students will study Church history and will focus on the following:

- The Marks of the Church from the Beginning
- The Growth of Christendom
- Faith Expressed in the Early Church
- Reforming the Church

They will also follow a course of study in Faith Formation Benchmarks which will include:

- Catholic Social Teaching
- Peace and justice
- Discipleship
- Nicene Creed
- Weekly school mass readings
- School wide Faith Formation topics which follow a four year cycle of:
  - o The Mass
  - o The Saints
  - Old Testament
  - New Testament

In addition, Grade 8 students will be prepared for the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation. Students will focus on:

- Gathering as Church
- Proclaiming God's Word
- Renewing Baptismal Promises
- Laying on of the Hands
- Anointing with Chrism
- Gifts of the Holy Spirit

Students will also participate in the preparation of school liturgies and various prayer services.

#### **LITERATURE**

Students in grade 8 will analyze literary elements through participation in literature circles and whole group discussion. Literary elements will include:

- Theme
- Setting
- Mood
- Point of View
- Dialogue
- Plot
- Conflict
- Irony
- Symbolism
- Suspense
- Foreshadowing
- Imagery

#### Literature genres will include:

- Fiction
- Historical fiction
- Memoirs
- Drama
- Informational Texts

Study will be comprised of literature circle discussions, written responses, and oral presentations. Students will also work to meet an Accelerated Reader goal each marking period.

#### WRITING/GRAMMAR

Writing course curriculum for grade 8 students will include writing the following:

- Narratives
- Informational Pieces
  - Compare and Contrast
  - Cause and Effect
- Research Paper
- Poetry
- Argumentative Essays
- Cross-curriculum papers and essays
- Oral presentations

#### Grammar lessons will focus on:

- Parts of Speech
- Capitalization
- Punctuation
- Editing/Revising

#### **SCIENCE**

Science for students in grade 8 builds on the process skills introduced in grade 7. Students develop their ability to work in a laboratory setting, using basic instrumentation, scientific methodology and a hands-on approach to problem solving.

Students will be exploring Physical Science in grade 8. Scientific concepts to be stressed in grade 8 will include but not be limited to:

- Motion and Energy
- Forces
- Forces in Fluids
- Work, Machines, and Energy
- Electricity
- Magnetism
- Properties of Matter
- Atoms, Elements, Compounds, and Mixtures,
- The Periodic Table
- Chemical Bonding
- Chemical Reactions and Equations

Students will also participate in The Future City Engineering Competition which integrates science, mathematics, language arts, and social studies benchmarks.

### **HEALTH**

Studies in this area for Grade 8 will give studies information and opportunities to build life-long health habits. They will include:

- Think First Stay Safe program
- Weekly editions of Current Health

#### **HISTORY**

Students in grade 8 will study U.S. History. Units will include:

- The Beginnings of American History
  - o Colonies Take Root
- Forming a New Nation
  - The American Revolution
  - Creating the Constitution
- The New Republic
  - The Birth of Political Parties
  - George Washington's Presidency
  - The Era of Thomas Jefferson
  - The Age of Jackson
- The Nation Expands and Changes
  - Age of Reform
  - Western Expansion
- Civil War and Reunion
  - The Civil War
  - Reconstruction and the New South

Students will also be expected to research and present current events.

## **MATHEMATICS**

Students in grade 8 will study:

- Number patterns
- Operations in Algebra
- Solve one, two, and multi-step equations
- Proportional reasoning and statistics
- Linear functions and graphing
- Inequalities and absolute value
- Systems of equations and inequalities
- Exponents and exponential functions
- Polynomials and factoring
- Quadratic functions
